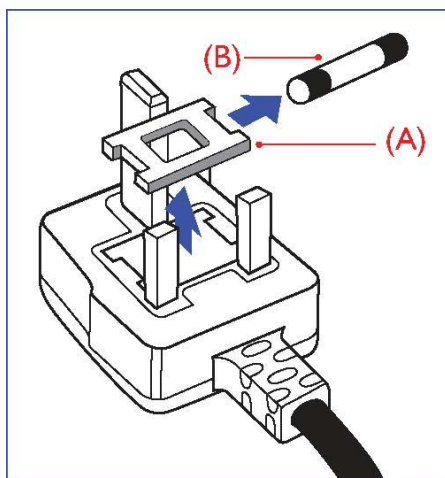

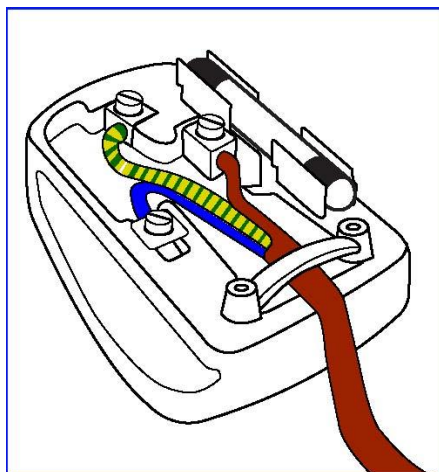

2. The BLUE wire must be connected to the terminal which is marked with the letter "N" or coloured BLACK.
3. The BROWN wire must be connected to the terminal which marked with the letter "L" or coloured RED.

Before replacing the plug cover, make certain that the cord grip is clamped over the sheath of the lead - not simply over the three wires.

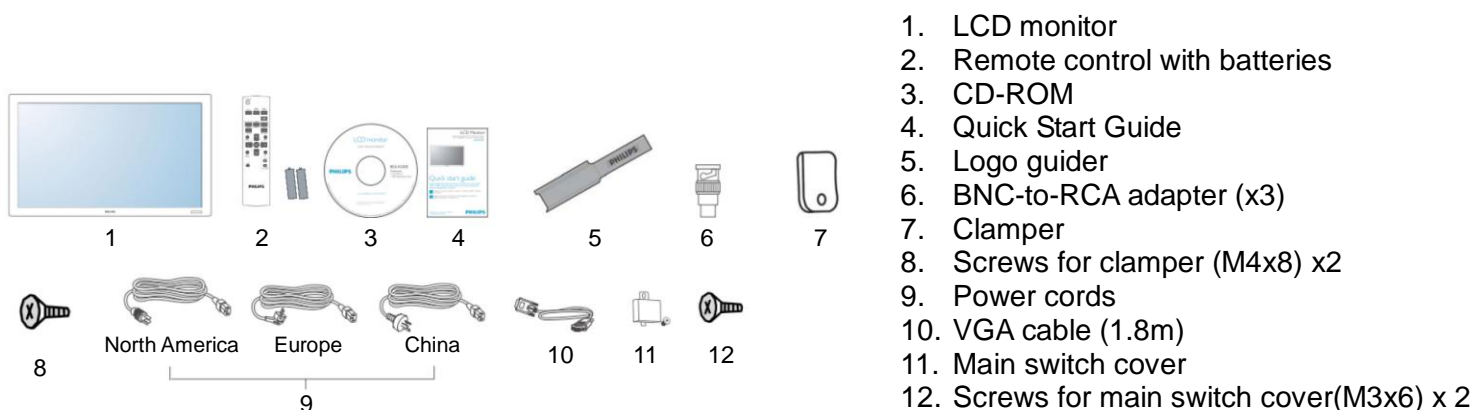
## 1. UNPACKING AND INSTALLATION

### 1.1. UNPACKING

- This product is packed in a carton, together with the standard accessories.
- Any other optional accessories will be packed separately.
- The weight of the product differs - depending on the type. Due to the size and weight it is recommended to move it by 2 people.
- After opening the carton, ensure that the content is in good condition and complete.

### 1.2. PACKAGE CONTENTS

Please verify that you received the following items with your package content:



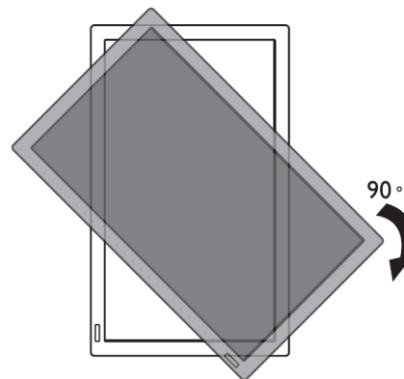
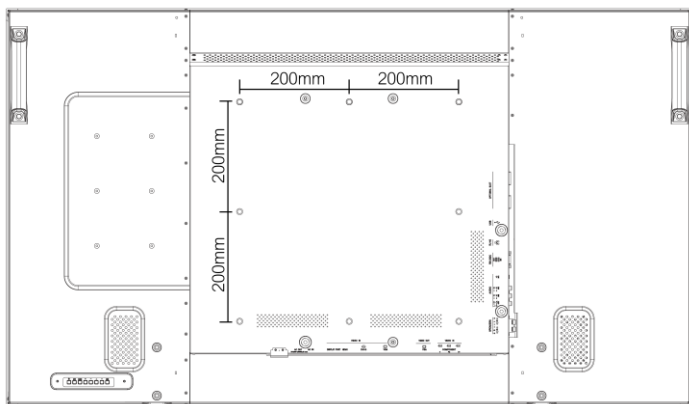
- Please make sure that for all other regions, apply a power cord that conforms to the AC voltage of the power socket and has been approved by and complies with the safety regulations of the particular country.
- You might like to save the package box and packing material for shipping the monitor.
- DVI box and table stands are prepared as options.

### 1.3. INSTALLATION NOTES

- Due to the high power consumption, always use the plug exclusively designed for this product. If an extended line is required, please consult your service agent.
- The product should be installed on a flat surface to avoid tipping. The distance between the back of the product and the wall should be maintained for proper ventilation. Avoid installing the product in the kitchen, bathroom or any other places with high humidity so as not to shorten the service life of the electronic components.
- The product can normally operate only under 4000m altitude. It might abnormally function in locations over 4000m altitude ~~and so~~ do not install and operate there.

## 1.4. PORTRAIT MOUNTING

### Wall mounting holes



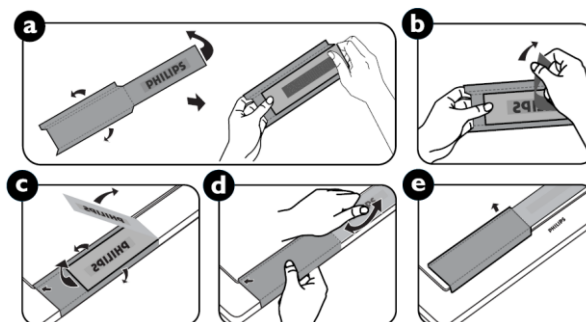
#### Notes:

- Metric 8 (12mm) screws are needed for wall mounting (not included).
- The mounting interface should comply with the UL1678 standard in North America. The mounting means should **be** strong enough to bear the weight of the monitor (approx. 38.7 kg without stand).

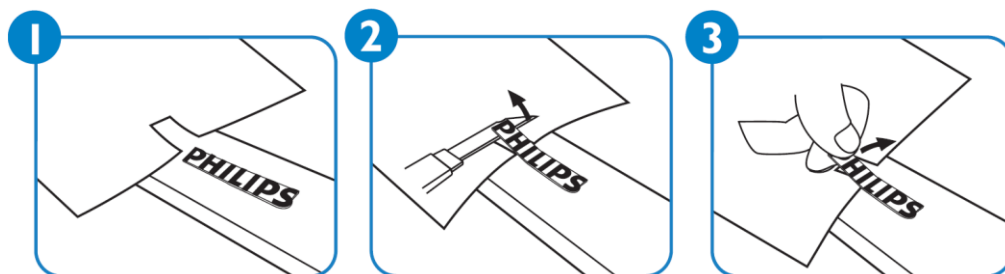
*Note: The remote control sensor should be on the lower side when rotating your monitor.*

#### How to use the Logo Guider for Portrait Mode?

- Before applying, make sure that the guider is in good condition. Fold the "PHILIPS" logo back in at the end of the guider.
- Peel off the back side of the protective film from the logo.
- Adjust the logo guider to align it with the long side of the front bezel and press the guider with your hand.
- Keep pressing the guider with your one hand and use the other hand to fold the logo out. Make sure that the logo is aligned with the front short bezel. Press firmly and repeatedly on the logo to make the logo stick tight on the front bezel.
- Remove the guider.

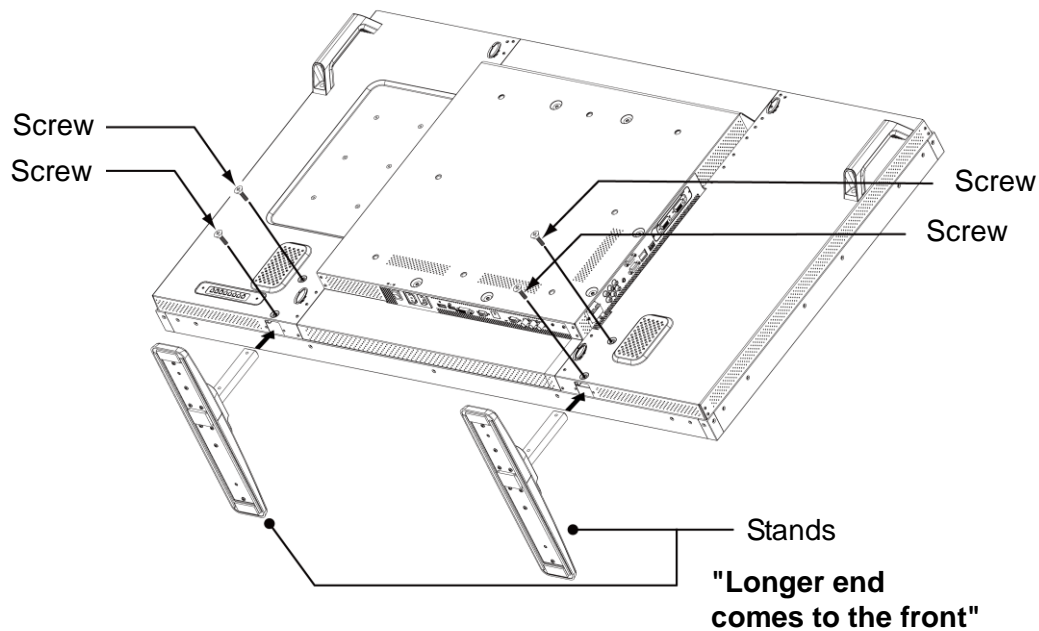
## 1.5. INSTALLING AND REMOVING STANDS

### 1.5.1 How to install stands

1. Please turn the monitor off.
2. After inserting the stand in the guide block, tighten the screws on both sides of the monitor.

**NOTE:**

The long end of the stand should face to the front while installing.



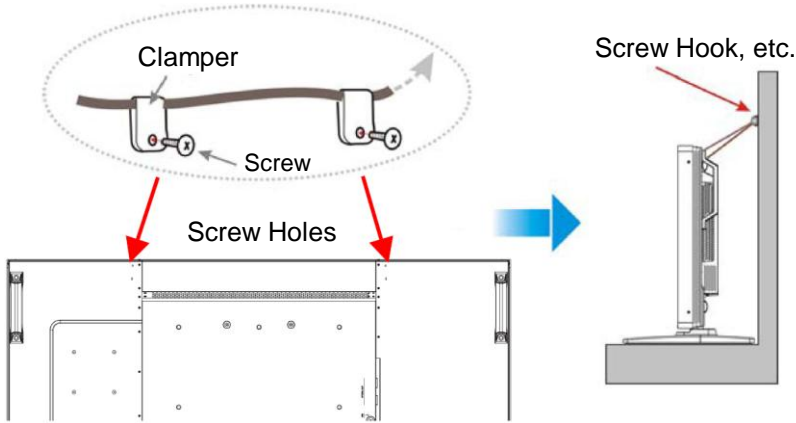
### 1.5.2 How to remove the stands

1. Spread the protective sheet on a flat surface.
2. Place the monitor face-down on a protective sheet.
3. Remove screws using a screwdriver and place them in a safe place for reuse.

### 1.5.3 Prevent monitor from falling

To prevent the monitor from tipping in the event of an earthquake or other incident, please follow these steps.

As shown in the figure below, secure the monitor to a solid wall or pillar using a cord which is strong enough to bear the weight of the monitor (BDL5571V: approx. 47.5 kg). Screw hooks (ring type) are recommended.

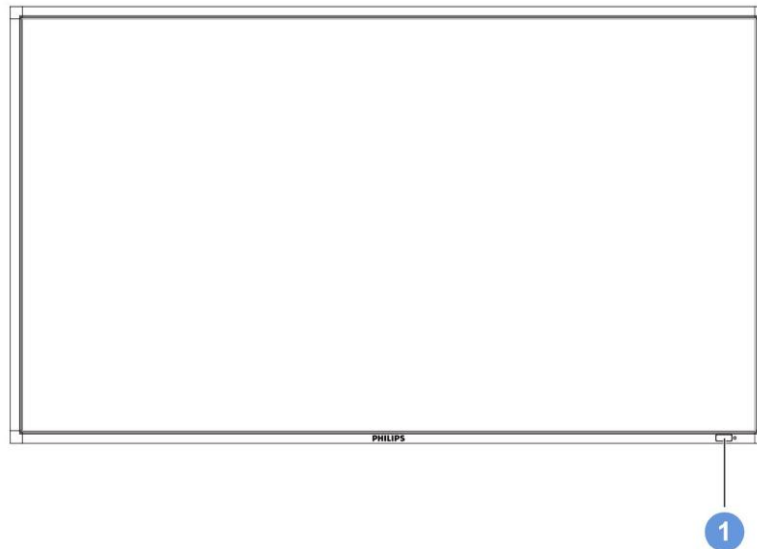


**Caution:**

## 2. PARTS AND FUNCTIONS

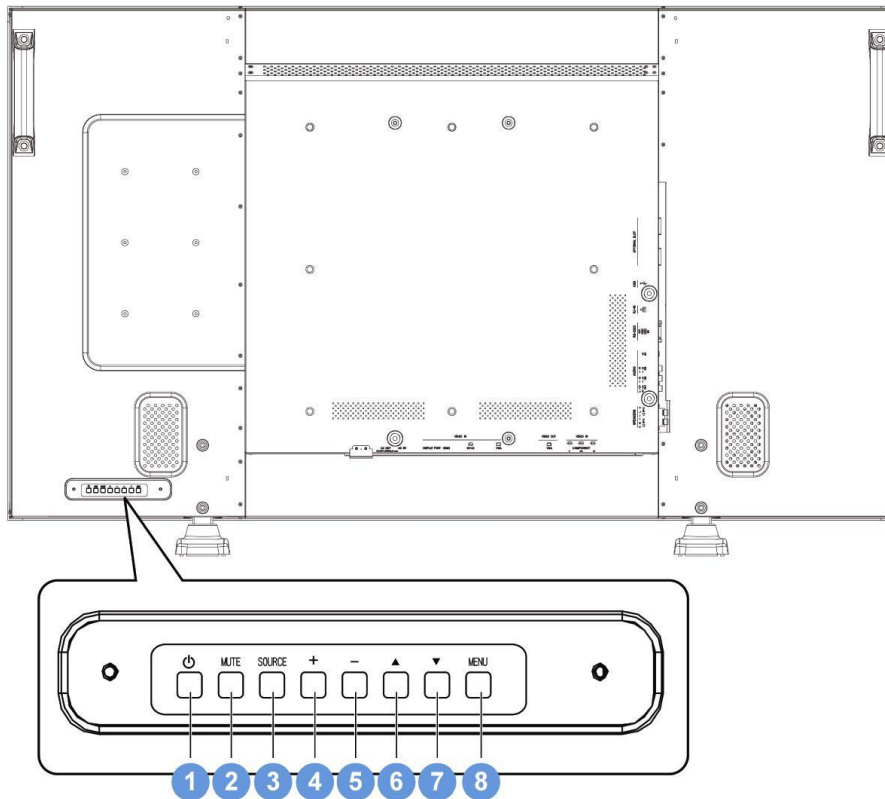
### 2.1. FRONT VIEW



#### 1. Remote control sensor, ambient light sensor and power status indicator

- Receives command signals from the remote control.
- Detects the ambient lighting condition around the monitor and the image brightness will be auto adjusted when “LIGHT SENSOR” set to “ON” on OSD menu.
- Indicates the operating status of the monitor:
  - lights green when the monitor is turned on
  - lights red when the monitor is in standby mode
  - lights amber when the monitor enters DPMS mode
  - When SCHEDULE is enabled, it would blink green and red
  - If the indicator blinks red, it tells that a failure is detected
  - Off when the main power of the monitor is turned off

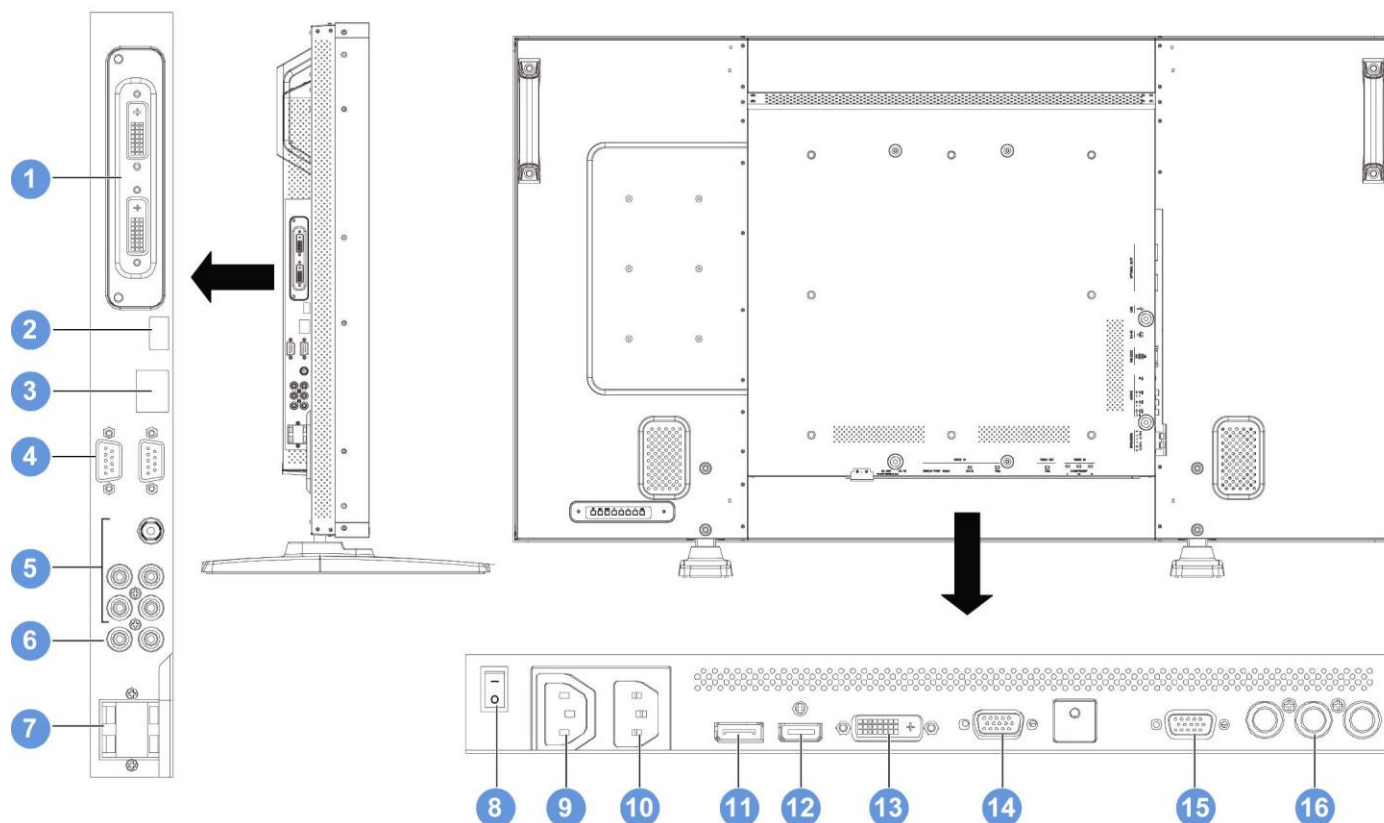
## 2.2. REAR VIEW



1. **POWER button (⏻)**  
To switch the power on or put the monitor to standby.
2. **MUTE button**  
To switch the audio mute ON/OFF.
3. **SOURCE button**  
To set the function while OSD menu is on or to activate input selection menu while OSD menu is off.
4. **PLUS (+) button**  
To increase the adjustment while OSD menu is on, or to decrease the audio output level while the OSD menu is off.
5. **MINUS (-) button**  
To decrease the adjustment while OSD menu is on, or to decrease the audio output level while the OSD menu is off.
6. **UP (▲) button**  
To move the highlight bar up to adjust the selected item while OSD menu is on.
7. **DOWN (▼) button**  
To move the highlight bar down to adjust the selected item while OSD menu is on.
8. **MENU button**  
To return to previous menu while OSD menu is on or to activate the OSD menu when the OSD menu is off.

**Note: Keyboard Control Lock Mode** This function completely disables the access to all Keyboard Control functions. To enable the keyboard control lock, press both of “▲” and “▼” buttons and hold down continuously for more than 3 seconds. To recover back to the user mode, press both of “▲” and “▼” and hold continuously for three 3 seconds.

RS232C network connection input/output for the use of loop through function.

### 5. AUDIO IN (AUDIO1/AUDIO2/ AUDIO3)

Connect to the audio output of a computer or an AV device.

### 6. AUDIO OUT R/L

Outputs the audio signal from the **AUDIO IN (AUDIO1/AUDIO2/AUDIO3)** or **HDMI** jack.



**7. SPEAKERS R/L**

Outputs the audio signal from the **AUDIO IN (AUDIO1/AUDIO2/AUDIO3)** or **HDMI** jack to external speakers.

**8. Main power switch**

Press to switch the main power on/off.

**9. AC OUT**

Connect to ~~the AC IN socket of another BDL5571V monitor or~~ an external media device. (Rating : 100~240Vac, 50-60Hz, 3A Max.)

**10. AC IN**

Connect the supplied power cord to the wall outlet.

**11. DISPLAY PORT**

Connect to the DisplayPort output of a PC or an AV device.

**12. VIDEO IN (HDMI)**

Connect to the HDMI output of an AV device or connect to the DVI-D output of a PC. (Using a DVI-HDMI cable)

**13. VIDEO IN (DVI-D)**

Connect to the DVI-D output of a PC or connect to the HDMI output of an AV device (Using a DVI-HDMI cable).

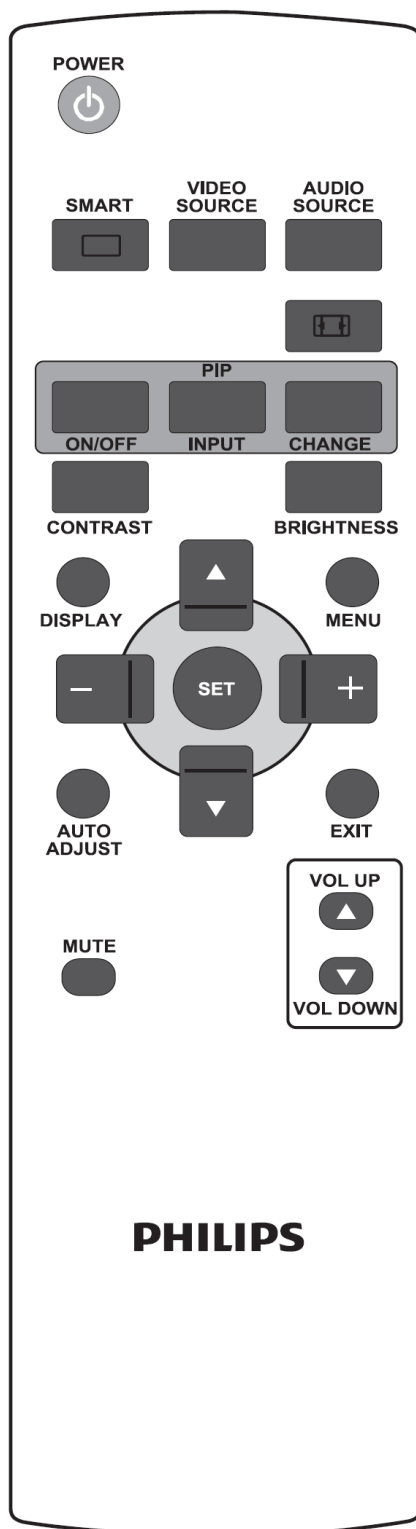

To activate the audio source selection menu. Press it repeatedly to select the audio input source from **HDMI**, **AUDIO1**, **AUDIO2**, and **AUDIO3**.



#### Picture format button

To switch screen aspect ratio between PC signal: **Full**, **Normal**, **Custom** and **Real**.

Video signal: **Full**, **Normal**, **Dynamic**, **Custom** and **Real**.

#### PIP (Picture In Picture) buttons



ON/OFF

**ON/OFF** button: To turn PIP mode ON/OFF.



INPUT

**INPUT** button: To select the input signal for the sub-picture.



CHANGE

**CHANGE** button: To exchange between the main picture and sub picture.

#### CONTRAST button

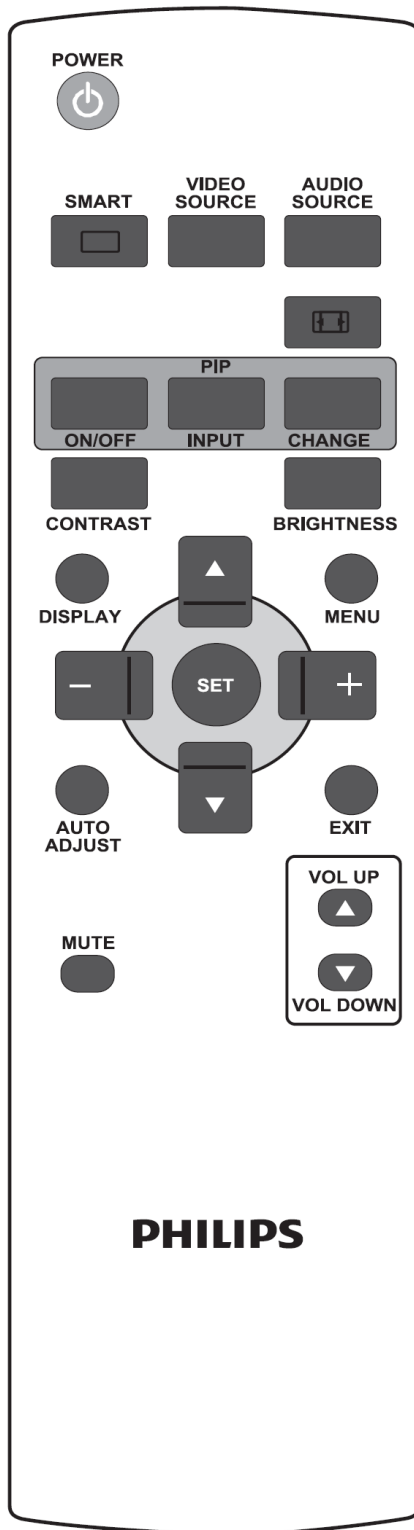

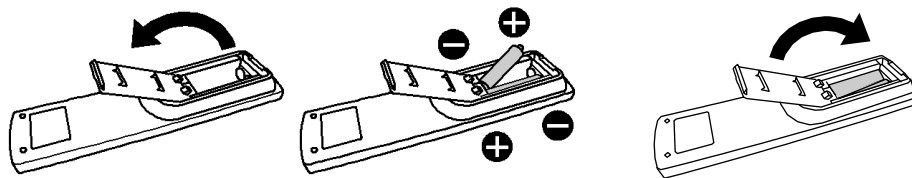

## 2.4.2. INSERTING THE BATTERIES IN THE REMOTE CONTROL



The remote control is powered by 1.5V AAA batteries. To install or replace batteries:

1. Press and slide to open the cover.
2. Align the batteries according to the (+) and (-) indications inside the case.
3. Replace the cover.

### Caution:

Incorrect use of batteries can result in leaks or bursting. Be careful especially about the following points.

- Place “AAA” batteries matching the + and - signs on each battery to the + and - signs of the battery compartment.
- Do not mix battery types.
- Do not combine new batteries with used ones. It causes shorter battery life or leakage of batteries.
- Remove dead batteries immediately to prevent battery liquid from leaking into the battery compartment. Don't touch exposed battery acid, it cause damage to your skin.

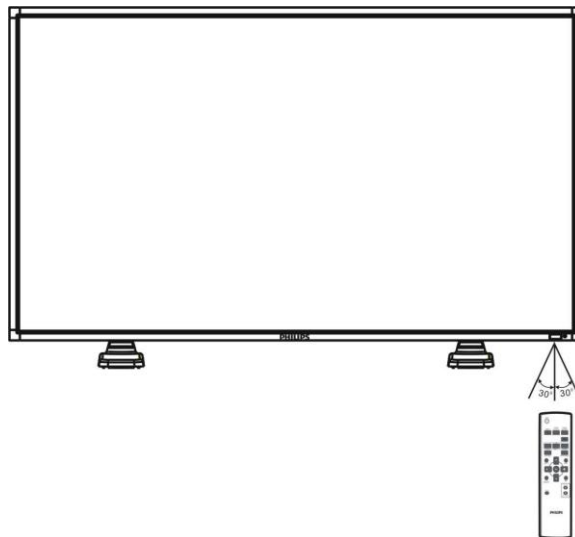

### Tint

*Note: For HDMI-Video timing, DVI-D(HD timing), DP(HD timing) and YPbPr inputs only.*

Adjust to change the color tint of the image.

Press the **SET/PLUS** button to open the submenu, and then press the **PLUS/MINUS** button to adjust. Press the **PLUS** button and the tone color becomes greenish. Press the **MINUS** button and the tone color becomes purplish.

Choose to turn on or off the film mode frame conversion function.

Press the **SET/PLUS** button to open the submenu, and then press the **UP/DOWN** button to toggle between

- **Auto** - Enable the film mode frame conversion function for movies and motion pictures. The monitor converts a 24 frames-per-second (24 fps) input signal format to DVD video signal format. Once this function is enabled, it is recommended that you set the **Scan conversion** function to **Progressive**.
- **Off** - Disable the film mode frame conversion function. This mode is suitable for TV broadcasting and VCR signals.

### IR control

Select the operation mode of the remote control when multiple BDL5571V monitors are connected via the RS232C connection.

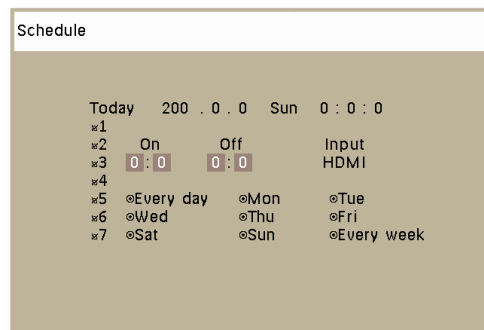


## Schedule

*Note: You should set up current date and time in Date and time before using this function.*

This function allows you to program up to seven different scheduled time intervals for the monitor. You can select the time the monitor turns on and turns off, the days in a week the monitor is activated, and which input source the monitor will use for each scheduled activation period.

1. Press the **SET/PLUS** button to open the submenu.



- Press the **UP/DOWN** button to select a schedule item (item 1 through item 7), and then press the **PLUS** button.
- With the **ON** item highlighted, press the **UP/DOWN** button to set the hour when the monitor will be turned on, then press the **PLUS** button to move to the minute slot to set the minute. If you do not want to use a power on time, select "\_\_\_" for the hour slot and minute slot.

4. Press the **PLUS** button to highlight the **OFF** item. 5. Press the **PLUS** button to highlight the **Input** item, and then press the **UP/DOWN** button to select an input source. If no input source is selected, the input source will remain the same as last selected.

7. If you want to set up more schedule items, press the **EXIT** button and then repeat the steps above. A check mark in the box next to the number of the schedule item indicates that the selected schedule is in effect.

Choose to turn **On** or **Off** the DDC/CI communication function. Select On for normal use.

Press the **SET/PLUS** button to open the submenu, and then press the **UP/DOWN** button to make selection.

### HDMI with EasyLink (One Wire)

This function gives you the ability to control your display through the HDMI connector using CEC(Consumer Electronics Control) commands.

Press the **SET/PLUS** button to open the submenu, and then press the **UP/DOWN** button to make selection.

### Smart power

Set the monitor to reduce the power consumption automatically.

Press the **SET/PLUS** button to open the submenu, and then press the **UP/DOWN** button to toggle between

- **Off**            • **Medium**
- **High**

### Auto signal detection

Choose to let the monitor detect and display available signal sources automatically.

Press the **SET/PLUS** button to open the submenu, and then press the **UP/DOWN** to make selection.

- **ON** - Set the monitor to display the image automatically once a signal is connected.
- **OFF** - Once a signal is connected, it can only be selected manually.



### **Setting cloning**

To store OSD setting of one display into the USB drive and clone the setting to another display. Press the **SET/PLUS** button to open the submenu, and then press the **UP/DOWN** button to toggle between

- **Monitor to USB** - When select **YES**, the OSD setting will be uploaded to USB device.
- **USB to monitor** - When select **YES**, the OSD setting will be downloaded from USB device to the monitor to change the OSD setting for this monitor.

### **Advanced option reset**

Reset all settings in the **Advanced option** menu.

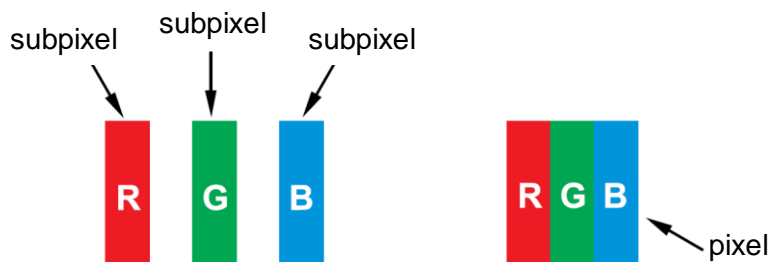
## 6. PIXEL DEFECT POLICY

Philips strives to deliver the highest quality products. We use some of the industry's most advanced manufacturing processes and practice stringent quality control. However, pixel or sub-pixel defects on the PDP / TFT panels used in Plasma- & LCD- displays are sometimes unavoidable. No manufacturer can guarantee that all panels will be free from pixel defects, but Philips guarantees that any Plasma- & LCD- displays with an unacceptable number of defects will be repaired during the warranty period in line with your local guarantee conditions.

This notice explains the different types of pixel defects and defines the acceptable defect level for the BDL5571V LCD screen. In order to qualify for repair under warranty, the number of pixel defects must exceed a certain level which is given in the reference table. If the LCD screen is within specification a warranty exchange / claim back will be refused. Additionally, because some types or combinations of pixel defects are more noticeable than others, Philips sets even higher quality standards for those.

### 6.1. PIXELS AND SUB-PIXELS

A pixel, or picture element, is composed of three sub-pixels in the primary colors of red, green and blue. Many pixels together form an image. When all sub-pixels of a pixel are lit, the three colored sub-pixels together appear as a single white pixel. When all are dark, the three colored sub-pixels together appear as a single black pixel. Other combinations of lit and dark sub-pixels appear as single pixels of other colors.



### 6.2. TYPES OF PIXEL DEFECTS + DOT DEFINITION

Pixel and sub-pixel defects appear on the screen in different ways. There are three categories of pixel defects and several types of sub-pixel defects within each category.

#### Dot definition = What is a defective "Dot"?




One or more defective, adjacent sub-pixel are defined as one "dot". The no. of defective sub-pixels are not relevant to define a defective dot. This means that a defective dot can consist of one, two or three defective sub-pixels which can be dark or lit.



One dot = One Pixel; consists of three sub-pixels of Red; Green and Blue




### 6.3. BRIGHT DOT DEFECTS

Bright dot defects appear as pixels or sub-pixels that are always lit or "on". These are the examples of bright dot defects:

### 6.5. PROXIMITY OF PIXEL DEFECTS

Because pixel and sub-pixels defects of the same type that are nearby one another may be more noticeable, Philips also specifies tolerances for the proximity of pixel defects. In the table below you can find specifications about:

- Allowed amount of adjacent dark dots = (adjacent dark dots = 1 pair of dark dots)
- Minimum distance between dark dots
- Total no. of all defective dots

### 6.6. PIXEL DEFECT TOLERANCES

In order to qualify for repair due to pixel defects during the warranty period, a PDP / TFT panel in a Philips Plasma / LCD- display must have pixel or sub-pixel defects exceeding the tolerances listed in the following table.

## 7. CLEANING AND TROUBLESHOOTING

### 7.1. CLEANING

#### Cautions When Using the Display

- Do not bring your hands, face or objects close to the ventilation holes of the display. Top of display is usually very hot due to the high temperature of exhaust air being released through the ventilation holes. Burns or personal injuries may occur if any body parts are brought too close. Placing any object near the top of the display could also result in heat related damages to the object as well as the display itself.
- Be sure to disconnect all cables before moving the display. Moving the display with its cables attached may damage the cables and thus case fire or electric shock danger.
- Disconnect the power plug from the wall outlet as a safety precaution before carrying out any type of cleaning or maintenance procedure.

#### Front Panel Cleaning Instructions

- The front of the display has been specially treated. Wipe the surface gently using only a cleaning cloth or a soft, lint-free cloth.
- If the surface becomes dirty, soak a soft, lint-free cloth in a mild detergent solution. Wring the cloth to remove excess liquid. Wipe the surface of the display to remove dirt. Then use a dry cloth of the same type to dry.
- Do not scratch or hit the surface of the panel with fingers or hard objects of any kind.
- Do not use volatile substances such as insert sprays, solvents and thinners.

#### Cabinet Cleaning Instructions

- If the cabinet becomes dirty, wipe the cabinet with a soft, dry cloth.
- If the cabinet is extremely dirty, soak a lint-free cloth in a mild detergent solution. Wring the cloth to remove as much moisture as possible. Wipe the cabinet. Use another dry cloth to wipe over until the surface is dry.
- Do not allow any water or detergent to come into contact with the surface of the display. If water or moisture gets inside the unit, operating problems, electrical and shock hazards may result.
- Do not scratch or hit the cabinet with fingers or hard objects of any kind.
- Do not use volatile substances such as insert sprays, solvents and thinners on the cabinet.
- Do not place anything made from rubber or PVC near the cabinet for any extended periods of time.
